“ I was shocked to find out yesterday that Jeff Meyer has passed away. Jeff was a long-time network expert who assisted many of us in educational technology in the Chicago suburbs for well over the past decade. I first met and worked with Jeff more than 15 years ago when I was serving as technology director in the Wilmette Public Schools District 39. At the time, Jeff was working for Graphtech, our network support company, and he specialized in Mac servers and networking.

I continued to work with Jeff for many more years. He was a tenacious problem solver and a lifelong learner. He was always current on new technologies, and there were always plenty of problems to solve as I moved to three more school districts where I continued to work with Jeff (Hinsdale 181, Des Plaines 62, and Winnetka 36).

Jeff would often arrive in the morning and stay late into the night while working on particularly challenging problems. My favorite quote from Jeff—which he seemed to use frequently when we worked together was—“I’ve never seen THAT before!” When Jeff said that, I knew we had a late night ahead, but I also knew he would eventually solve the problem(s).

I tried to hire Jeff at least three times, but he always remained fiercely loyal to Graphtech/All Covered. When I asked him why he wanted to stay with a company serving many clients, instead of working with a single company or school district, he told me that he liked the opportunity to be able to support and learn many different systems in many different types of environments. I always respected Jeff for knowing himself and his talents, and the fact that he found a work situation that allowed him to do what he did best.

I was one of many who directly benefitted from Jeff’s vast breadth and depth of knowledge, inherent curiosity, engineering sense, problem-solving talent, and most importantly, the ability to put it all together to serve others. I was saddened to learn of his passing and join countless others in grieving his loss. I offer my sincere condolences to Jeff’s family and colleagues during this difficult time, and hope they find some comfort in knowing how much Jeff contributed to tens of thousands of students, staff, and others over the years. Jeff will be sorely missed by many. He was among the best of the best.
